# PODGORICA

Podgorica became the capital of Montenegro in 1945. Not only are the Government and Parliament located here, but the town is also an economic, cultural, social, educational and sports center with important faculties



of the university and theaters. Many companies have located their headquarters in Podgorica. To fulfill all these demands it was necessary to rebuild the town, which was completely destroyed in World War II, and very quickly. For many it happened too quickly. Almost nothing reminds one of the old Podgorica.

Podgorica was founded more than 2000 years ago. Even today one can still follow the footsteps of the Romans, who built the town of Doclea here.

While Doclea served as the headquarters for the Emperor of the Prevalis province, Byrziminium, just a few kilometers south, had more the character of a trading post.

During the 9<sup>th</sup> century immigrant Slavs came into power in the region. They founded the town and state of Duklja in the area of Byrziminiums. In their Golden Age they were ruling over the Zeta and Moraca valleys, the region around Lake Skadar and parts of the coast. The Turks turned Podgorica, which was its name since 1474, into a real fortress. They stayed





until 1879. In 1946, after the creation of Yugoslavia, the town was named Titograd. In 1992 it got its old name back, Podgorica.

The modern sport in Podgorica starts its development during the last years nineteen century, as natural continuance of traditional games such as throwing weight, shooting and flying and standing jump. The very first competitions as well as the building sport's ground initiated development in a period when Montenegroprincipality. Since the time of establishing first sport organizations till now, sport in Podgorica gathers many young people. These organizations gave us the great number of talented individuals who

represented Podgorica in Europe and worldwide. Soccer, basketball, volleyball, handball, karate and boxing honored Podgorica's sport here and aboard. Current champions of Serbia and Montenegro are our men team in volleyball and women team in handball, and our basketball club played play-off this year. Last year we reached the highest result of

Montenegrin sport ever. Namely, The Karate Klub "Buducnost" became the equip champions of Europe. Besides, they also were Yugoslav champions for 13 times.

Sincenow, many significant sport events were organized in Podgorica:

- First Mediterranean Karate Championship, 1987;
- Senior Karate European Championship 1989, etc.
- 1<sup>st</sup> European university karate championship 2003.
- 12<sup>th</sup> Mediterranean karate championship 2003.
- 33<sup>rd</sup> European karate championship cadet and juniors 2006.

Podgorica was organizer and host for one qualification group of European Basketball Championship in 2005.

Montenegro belongs to the Middle Mediterranean region of southern Europe and is one of the two federal units of the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia.

Montenegro borders on Albania to the southeast, the Adriatic Sea to the south, and Croatia and Bosnia and Herzegovina to the west.

#### Visas

Citizens of the following countries can enter and stay for tourist reasons in the Republic of Montenegro individually or in organized groups with a valid passport ,previously obtaining a tourist pass on the border crossing for a30 day tourist stay with one entrance and exit: Iceland, Republic of Ireland, The United Kingdom, France, Germany, Denmark, Switzerland, Austria, Netherlands, Belgium, Luxembourg, Poland, Czech Republic, Republic of Slovakia, Hungary, Romania, Bulgaria, Albania, Greece, Cyprus, Spain, Portugal, Italy, Monaco, Malta, Liechtenstein, Russian Federation, Ukraine, Byelorussia, Moldavia, Norway, Sweden, Finland, Estonia, Leetonia, Lithuania, San Marino, Vatican, Andorra, Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, FRY of Macedonia and Israel.

#### Currency

Money in use in Montenegro is EURO 1 EUR=100 cents Coin:1,2,5,10,20,50 cents and 1,2 EUR Paper currency: 5,10,20,50,100,200 and 500 EUR

#### Banks

Working hours: from 8a.m.7p.m. every working day, from 8 a.m. 1 p.m. on Saturday, on Sundays closed. Traveller's cheques can be exchanged at the Komercijalna Bank in Budva. In the Podgorička Bank in Podgorica you can obtain cash from your VISA credit card.

#### **Foreign currency regulations**

Foreign citizens can bring into Montenegro an unlimited amount of foreign currency which has to be declared when entering the country. You are allowed to take out of Montenegro foreign currencies amounted to not more than 500 EUR unless have declared more money at customs while entering Montenegro.

#### **Vehicle Insurance**

Tourists, who bring their own vehicles to Montenegro, are obliged to pay short-term insurance for their vehicles at the border crossing.Exceptions include foreign drivers from countries with which Montenegro has a special agreement. The International Motor Insurance Card ("green card") is valid for foreign drivers from the following countries: Albania, Andorra, Austria, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina ,Bulgaria, Croatia, Cypress, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Hungary, Germany, Greece, Iceland, Republic of Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Luxembourg, FRY of Macedonia, Moldavia, Norway, Republic of Slovakia, Slovenia, Portugal, Spain, Sweeden, Switzerland, Netherlands, The United Kingdom, Tunisia, Turkey, Romania, Poland, Ukraine, Malta, Morocco, Israel and Iran.

#### Petrol

The following types of petrol are available at all petrol stations in Montenegro:

#### **Air Transportation**

You can travel by air to Montenegro, arriving at one of the two international airports: Podgorica and Tivat. The national airline company "**Montenegro Airlines**" operates scheduled flights to Belgrade, Budapest, Vienna, Zurich, Frankfurt, Dusseldorf, Ljubljana and Rome. Scheduled flights from Montenegro are also operated by JAT, Adria Airways and Pelican Blue Line to Belgrade, Ljubljana, Skopje and Bari.

**Airport Golubovci (Podgorica)** is: 12km from Podgorica, 170km from Žabljak, 62km from Budva, 65km from Bar. *Information*: 081/243 007, 244 916

**Airport Tivat** is: 3km from Tivat, 20km from Budva, 20km from Herceg Novi, 4km from Kotor, 60km from Bar, 84km from Ulcinj. *Information*: 082/ 671 337, 671 894

#### **Sea Transportation**

Montenegro is connected to the whole world by sea transportation. Ferries and freighters regularly operate between the lines Bar- Bari and Bar- Ankona.

The international ports of Bar, Budva and Herceg Novi receive all kinds of vessels. The ports of Bar and Kotor also have marinas for yachts and boats and offer all kinds of sevices.

# GENERAL REGULATIONS

#### **Participation**

Participants are nominated by the national federation of the competitor's country. Only these participants qualify for an EUSA championship:

- Students who are officially registered for and pursuing a course of study at a university or similar institute whose status as a university is recognized by the appropriate national academic authority of their country;
- Former students of the institutions mentioned in previous paragraph who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the academic year proceeding the event.

#### **Entry Procedure**

Complete the entry forms and return them.

#### **Entry Fee**

Each competing country is to pay the following fee to EUSA: - active EUSA members: 20 EUR per person

#### **Participation Fee**

Participation fee is 45 EUR per person per day for official delegation (22person,including 17 competitors and 5 officials), another member of delegations pay 65 EUR per day. The fee includes board and lodging accommodation (with 3 meals daily). Along with the quantitative form participants have to pay a 50% participation fee deposit to the following account:
