# **Beijing Games emblem**

The symbolical sign of 1<sup>st</sup> International Wu Bo Games in Beijing is designed with the inspiration of two Chinese traditional musical instruments – drums and blue and white porcelain drums. The features of 13 fighting sports events in this game are reflected vividly through this creative idea of the image: drum-shaped flip and rotation of the Earth. Furthermore, the wrap-up of the "big drum" is fully filled with images of intellectual tan grams to form a decorative and orderly visual motion graphics. In particular, the symbol of the International Fighting Association is placed on the drum surface, indicating to hit the drum. Accompanied by the rat plans, athletes from all over the world will play actively in venues in Beijing. The sign gives a sonorous, powerful and thunderous cheers of visual perception, and also the visual tension and beauty of this sign are enhanced more by vivid and orderly movement of 13 icons and drums three-dimensional effect.

# General information

In March 2009, SportAccord signed an agreement with the city of Beijing, P. R. China, to organise the first SportAccord Combat Games. Scheduled from 28 August to 4 September 2010, the competition will showcase 13 Martial Arts and Combat sports, both Olympic and non-Olympic. The event will also include a Cultural Program that will reflect the social and cultural values of these sports and Combat Games as a whole.

The organizer covers all travel costs (from / to Beijing), accommodation and transport for each sport up to 120 people (athletes, referees and officials). The organizer also covers all expenses concerning security, medical care, volunteers, media plan etc. The total budget for the promoter of these games is about USD 9.35 million

Each sport will have top athletes competing in the 2010 SportAccord Combat Games. These athletes will go through the qualification system set up by their respective International Federation. It is expected that the world best martial arts and combat sports athletes will

qualify for the Combat Games. Both male and female athletes will take part. For those sports requiring weigh-in, different weight categories will be included.

During the eight days of competition, the 2010 SportAccord Combat Games will also include a cultural program. Indeed, martial arts and combat sports have rich cultural heritages and convey social and educational values. The Combat Games will then serve as a great opportunity to enable deeper understanding of the sports by the public.

## **The Sports**

13 Sports will be showcased in the Combat Games. All 13 sports are officially recognized by SportAccord. They enjoy a long history, established competition rules, approved safety measures, wide practice and large fan base.

### Ju-Jitsu - International Ju Jitsu Federation (JJIF)



Ju-Jitsu is a generic term for an almost indefinable system of fighting, primarily unarmed, but in some instance using weapons. Ju-Jitsu Techniques are including of punching, kicking, striking, throwing, holding, locking, choking and tying as well as the use of certain weapons. Ju-Jitsu does not rely on brute strength but upon skill and finesse. It is the use of

minimum effort to achieve maximum effect. Applying this principle enables anyone, regardless of physique or stature, to control and release their energy to its greatest potential.

#### Extra officials

The cost of the extra officials will be covered by the NF or individual

Cost will be around 180 USD per person per night for single occupancy (including full board, and local transportation Airport – Hotel – Venues – Official Functions) and around 130 USD per person per night for double occupancy (same conditions as above)

Extra officials will benefit from the same services than the other officials: Air travel and accommodation organisation, accreditation, local transport, meals. In order to have an access to these services, coaches need to be listed as Extra officials by JJIF.

The services Beijing will provide to the coaches will depend on whether they are considered extra officials or not.

Coaches can be accommodated in the Athletes hotel (the Friendship hotel) depending on availability.

#### Registration

Accreditation, flights and hotel booking will all be arranged by LOC, they are currently working on a registration form and procedure that we will make available to all IF as soon as it is finalised.

LOC will appoint a travel agency to arrange flight and accommodation bookings that accompanying persons can contact directly (i.e. fans, family etc that do no. count as Extra Official)

Each IF should decide whether they want to coordinate the registrations for the athletes, delegate it to the NF or if they let the responsibility to the athletes and officials to return the form.

The registration form has the option for coaches to indicate which athletes they are accompanying

As the registration form is currently being elaborated, we will ask to make sure there is an option for coordinating trips, to enable athletes and the accompanying extra-officials to be travelling together

Coordination on site

We would like to ask the accompanying officials to coordinate their athletes. The persons responsible will be accommodated in the Athletes hotel.

## The venues

Three Indoor competition venues are required for the SportAccord Combat Games with minimum 3000 seats for each venue. One training venue is necessary. These venues are close to each other and from the participants' hotels.

For the 2010 SportAccord Combat Games, Beijing owns many competition venues with complete facilities, equipment and high standard conditions that fully meet the

requirements for hosting international sports events. In order to successfully host the 2010 SportAccord Combat Games, here are the chosen competition and training venues, which all hosted Olympic events during the Beijing Olympic Games in 2008.

The venues are as follows:



#### **National Indoor Stadium**

#### Beijing Science & Technology University Gymnasium

Place: University of Science & Technology Beijing

Type of Venue: newly renovated, it hosted Judo and Taekwondo competitions during the Beijing Olympic Games

Floor Space: 24,662 square meters

Fixed seats: 4,000

Hosting: Judo, Ju-Jitsu, Karate, Kendo and Taekwondo
