Romania & Bucharest

General Information

Bucharest is the capital and largest city of Romania, as well as its cultural, industrial, and financial center. It is located in the southeast of the country, at 44°25'57"N 26°06'14"E, on the banks of the Dambovitza River.

Known in the past as "The Little Paris ", Bucharest has changed a lot lately and today it has become a very interesting mix of old and new that has a little to do with its initial reputation. Finding a 300 years old church near a steel-and-glass building that sit both next to a communist style building is common place in Bucharest.

Some people enjoy the unique mix of architecture, while others feel uncomfortable around the gray buildings and the lack of western style tourist attractions. However, Bucharest offers some excellent attractions, and, in recent years, cultivated a sophisticated and modern sensibility that many have come to expect from a European capital.





On Arrival



Bucharest Henri Coanda International Airport is situated at 16,5 km distance from Bucharest down-town.

Access roads: The National Road DN 1

The **783 Express line** connects Bucharest Henri Coandă International Airport with the city center. This line runs day and night. At night, the bus leaves every 40 minutes.

Airport stops: In front of the Arrivals Terminal and Departures Terminal

Price for one trip is 3,5 lei (less than 1 EUR).

The magnetic card valid for two travels costs 7 lei (less than 2 EUR).

Card desk: In front of the Arrivals Terminal

Taxis are available at the taxi station located at the exit of the terminal and take passengers in order of arrival. Touch screen terminals for taxi requests are available for customers who want to order taxi from a certain company. The trip to city center costs around 10-15 Euro (payable only in lei, Romanian currency), depending on traffic conditions and chosen company. Normal rate is about 1.40 lei/km (about 0.25 EUR).

Rent a car counters are located within the passageway between the Departures Terminal and the Arrivals Terminal.

Currency

The official currency in Romania is "leu", also known under the abbreviation RON, and foreign currencies will not be accepted outside the airport. Foreign currencies can be exchanged in banks, as well as in many foreign currency exchange offices which can be found all over the city. Banks are usually open from 9am to 5pm or 6pm, from Monday to Friday. Currency exchange offices are available in the arrivals area of the Henri Coanda airport, some of them offering non-stop schedule.

Weather

During autumn, daytime temperatures vary between 17 and 22 °C (63 and 72 °F) and may go down to around 10 °C (56 °F) during the night.

Electricity

In Romania the power sockets are of type F. The standard voltage is 230 V and the standard frequency is 50 Hz.

You can use your electric appliances in Romania, if the standard voltage in your country is in between 220 - 240 V (as is in the UK, Europe, Australia and most of Asia and Africa). Your need for a power plug adapter depends on the power plugs used in your own country.

Communication

To call Romania from abroad, dial the international code 00 followed by 40 for Romania, then the number without the first 0.

Calling overseas from Romania: for direct dialing, 00 + country code + area code + telephone number.

Sales Tax

Romania has a VAT (Value Added Tax) of 19% added to retail prices. Hotels, restaurants and shopping centers have the VAT included in the retail price. Starting 2013 Romania has a VAT of 9% at all bread products.

If you want to claim a Sales Tax Refund make sure you have all the things listed below:

- a. Your purchases were made from a store which issued a legal invoice or receipt as well as a tax refund form,
- b. Total value of purchased good is higher than 300 LEI (~70EURO),
- c. Your purchases were made 90 days or less before you leave Romania,
- d. You have all the original receipts and store identified VAT Refund forms validated by the Customs Office.

With all of these you can claim your VAT Refund at VAT refund offices present at any Romanian border crossing point.

Attention: All refunds at Customs Office will be made in LEI NOT IN Euro or USD.

Tipping

Taxi drivers, the valets at the hotel, waiters at the restaurant expect to be tipped.

A tip is normally not added onto a restaurant bill. A usual tip would be about 10% of the bill, but it is not a must. Tip just if the people seem to deserve.

Insurance

No insurance is concluded for the participants (athletes, coaches, umpires, assistants, members of the delegations etc.) at the 4th WGKF Championship 2017. We draw explicit attention to the fact that all participants and members of the individual delegations have to take out their own personal insurance (liability insurance, health insurance, etc.). The Romanian Karate Federation and the Organizing Committee will not assume any corresponding costs and reject any form of liability.

Passport

A valid passport is required for all overseas/ non-EU visitors.

Your passport must be valid for the entire duration of your visit (it will not expire sooner than your intended date of departure). However, please check the expiration date on your passport carefully before traveling to Europe. Although Romania is not part of the Schengen agreement, some airlines (i.e. Lufthansa) may refuse boarding at your point of origin or while transferring planes if your passport is not valid for at least three months beyond your intended date of departure. You could also be denied entry when you arrive in the Schengen area.

Citizens of the European Union countries can enter Romania with a valid passport or with their National Identity Card.

Visa Requirements

Citizens of certain countries and territories need a visa to visit Romania. To quickly check if you need a visa please go to www.E-Visa.MAE.ro, select the "Get Informed" tab (up left) and enter the following information: passport issuing country, type of passport, purpose of your visit to Romania.


The venue is a multi-purpose indoor facility, conveniently located in a central part of the city. Parking is available at the venue.

The Logo



The Dacian Draco (or Wolf) was the standard ensign of troops of the ancient Dacian people, which can be seen in the hands of the soldiers of Decebalus in several scenes depicted on Trajan's Column in Rome, Italy. It has the form of a dragon with open wolf-like jaws containing several metal tongues. The hollow dragon's head was mounted on a pole with a fabric tube affixed at the rear. In use, the draco was held up into the wind, or above the head of a horseman, where it filled with air and gave the impression it was alive while making a shrill sound as the wind passed through its strips of material.

The "draco" was seen by the Dacians (predecessors of the Romanians) as a special protective symbol, giving them courage and strength when facing an encounter with the enemies of their time.

With our championship logo, which is a stylized representation of the Dacian Draco, we intend to transfer these symbols to all competitors and encourage them to show their strength and be winners on the tatami and in life.

Ages for Divisions

For Cadets, Juniors, U21 and Seniors WKF Rules apply. Allocation to age category is determined by the age of the athlete at the first day of the applicable event (i.e. the first competition day for the specific category).

Touristic Information

Known for its wide, tree-lined boulevards, glorious Belle Époque buildings and a reputation for the high life (which in the 1900s earned its nickname of "Little Paris"), Bucharest, Romania's largest city and capital, is today a bustling metropolis.

Romanian legend has it that the city of Bucharest was founded on the banks of the Dambovita River by a shepherd named Bucur, whose name literally means "joy." His flute playing reportedly dazzled the people and his hearty wine from nearby vineyards endeared him to the local traders, who gave his name to the place.

Some of the landmarks that you could visit during your stay are: The Arch of Triumph (Arcul de Triumf), Calea Victoriei (Victory Avenue), Revolution Square (Piata Revolutiei), The Royal Palace (Palatul Regal), The Romanian Athenaeum (Ateneul Roman), Old Town Bucharest (Centrul Vechi), Manuc's Inn (Hanul lui Manuc), Parliament Palace (Palatul Parlamentului).

Trip to Dracula Castle
